**ILLNESS PRECEDURE FOR YOUNG STUDENTS: If a child becomes ill at school, especially a younger child, we will follow the procedure below in determining whether their parents should be called to come get them. This follows the guidelines found on About Child Care.com. We need to remember that a sick child can create stress for families in many ways. Not only are there concerns for the young person's well being but also with work deadlines and absences if a parent must stay home or come to school to get a sick child. Many children with mild illnesses can safely and happily attend school. A cold, for example, most likely can be handled with some over-the-counter medicine before and after a child's school day. But parents also must know what the school procedures are for such instances and follow guidelines devised for the health and safety of ALL children in their class.**

**SIGNS TO WATCH FOR AND QUESTIONS TO ASK:**

- ❖ Does the child feel well enough to participate in the class activities and the school activities? Are they lethargic?
- ❖ Will the continued presence of the child in the classroom put other children at risk?
- ❖ Is there any evidence of or concern about a contagious disease that would require isolation from others?
- ❖ Does the child look or act like they are ill?
- ❖ Does the child have a temperature above 100 degrees?
- ❖ Does the child exhibit uncontrolled coughing, difficulty breathing, wheezing, persistent crying or lethargy?
- ❖ Does the child have diarrhea or loose or runny stools and can they make it to the bathroom in time?
- ❖ Has the child vomited? If so—they should be sent home and the parents told they should not return for a minimum of 24 hours.
- ❖ If they have a rash, investigate it. If it is accompanied by a fever or behavioral changes, the child should go home.

We need to act with caution, but also with reasonableness. A child who has a slight temperature (under 100) and who appears happy and energetic should NOT be sent home.
